Medzinárodná porota



Prof. Krzysztof Szydzisz /Poland/ - chairman of the jury

The choirmaster, musicologist, specialist in voice production and cultural manager. As a conductor of the Adam Mickiewicz University Chamber Choir he has been moulding its sound and repertoire profile since 1992, when the choir was founded. A graduate of the Catholic University of Lublin (musicology) as well as the Academy of Music in Poznan (vocal-actor faculty) and the Academy of Music in Bydgoszcz (choral conducting), he also completed postgraduate studies in voice production, speech therapy, higher education management and culture management. At present, Krzysztof

Szydzisz works at the Academy of Music in Bydgoszcz as Professor and Head of the Department of Voice Production, which was founded in 2004. Besides his academic and didactic activity, he regularly organizes workshops and courses in cooperation with recognized musicologists, conductors and specialists in speech therapy and voice production. Since 1998 he has been the Artistic Director of the International Festival of University Choirs 'Universitas Cantat'. Together with the AMU Chamber Choir he has performed on five continents in over twenty countries, always winning the highest laurels of competitions both within Poland and abroad. Although the man has a broad and incredibly diverse range of musical interests, the 19th and 20th century European choral literature is his chosen forte.



Prof. Vanessa Leão /Macao/

Leão is an Associate Professor of the Music Department of the Macau Polytechnic Institute. She was appointed as a council member and adjudicator of the World Choir Games and is the Vice-President of the Executive Committee of the Macau Choral Arts Association and Macau Chorus Association, Council Member of the China Chorus Association, as well a member of the International Federation of Choral Music and the International Society of Music Education.

Leão has been active as a choral conductor over the past twenty years and has been invited to conduct in different occasions such

as Macau Handover Ceremony, Macau International Music Festival, Macau Arts Festival, China International Chorus Festival, Bejing Modern Music Festival and World Peace Choral Festival in Vienna, etc. She founded the Macau Polytechnic Institute Choir and Dolce Voce in 2005 and 2008 respectively and has been Music Director of the choirs since then. She was appointed as Music Director of Macau Cultural Center Children's Choir and Macau Perosi Choir as well.

INTERNATIONAL JURY

doc. Elena Šarayová-Kováčová /Slovakia/

Elena Šarayová-Kováčová studied piano, composition and conducting at Bratislava Music Conservatory. Later she continued her conducting studies at the University of Performing Arts (VŠMU) in Bratislava to become the first female professional conductor in Slovakia. In addition to Female Chamber Orchestra, she has been also leading Bratislava Children's Choir (since 1967), and between 1971 and 1986 she was the conductor and the art director of the Slovak Teacher Female Choir OZVENA. With these music ensembles she has performed at many stages in almost all European countries as well as



in Japan, Canada, USA, and in Africa. Her concert activities frequently alternate with methodical work as a jury member at various competitions, teacher work at manifold choir workshops and conductors training. She teaches at the composition and conducting at the Department of the Dance and Music Faculty at the University of Performing Arts in Bratislava.

MgA. Marek Klimeš /Czech Republic/

He is currently graduate of Orchestra conducting at the Janáček Academy of Music and Performing Arts (JAMU) in Brno in class of professor Rostislav Hališka. He is also a graduate of Choir conducting at Palacký University in Olomouc. His conducting career started with choir Campanella Olomouc with which he's been through tens of concerts in the Czech Republic and abroad (Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, Slovenia, France, Russia, Argentina, Thailand and more). He also collaborated with chamber choir Bel Canto. As a conductor he is laureate of following awards: Neerpelt (Belgium) 2007 gold



medal, first award, Grand Prix St. Petersburg 2008 silver medal, Musica Religiosa Olomouc 2009 gold medal. He used to be acting conductor of university choir Coro Grande at the Department of Music Education of Palacký University. During his studies at JAMU in Brno, he's had many experiences of orchestra conducting. He performed with many orchestral projects, he collaborated with The Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra, The Orchestra of Bohuslav Martinů Zín, Pilsen Philharmonics, Janáček's Academic Orchestra etc. For two years he's been art director and conductor of Chordata – a chamber orchestra of JAMU students. During his studies he's attended numerous conducting classes (G. Richter, Z. Nagy, T. Netopil etc.) Since 2014 he's become the director of Festa Musicale and of other cultural projects, previously led by his father, Jiří Klimeš.

Doc. Ondrej Šaray, ArtD. /Slovakia/

Ondrej Šaray studied orchestral conducting with Zdeněk Bílek at the Conservatory in Bratislava. He also studied with Ladislav Slovák at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava. Since 1983 he has worked as the conductor of the Bratislava Children's Choir. In 1987 he estabilished the Youth Choir Echo and in 1992 the Amadeus Choir Bratislava. Ondrej Šaray has won many significant domestic and international awards with these choirs. As a conductor, he has performed throughout Europe, Canada, Africa, the USA and he also cooperated with the noted orchestras of Slovakia (Philharmonic

Orchestra, State Philharmonic Orchestra Košice, State Chamber Orchestra Žilina). He and his choirs appear regularly in vocal-instrumental compositions with the Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra, Slovak Chamber Orchestra of Bohdan Warchal, Capella Istropolitana and Musica Aeterna. Ondrej Šaray has also made recordings for Slovak Radio, Slovak Television and BBC London. Besides conducting, he teaches at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava.



Mgr. Jana Scheinerová /Slovakia/

Jana Scheinerová /born in 1974/ finished her university studies in 1997 at University of Performing Arts in Bratislava, Dance Art Department, with the specialisation in Pedagogic studies of Folk Dance, where she also received her doctor's degree in 2007. She has cooperated as co-author and lecturer in dance projects "Creativity in games" and "Non-traditional inspirative meetings" aimed for the whole Slovakia in IUVENTA art centre between years 2001-2003.Since 1994 she has worked in School of Art of Jozef Kresánek in Bratislava as dance teacher and she is also the director of the

school's Dance Department. She has been working with Children folklore group Čečinka for 18 years and has won with this group many awards both home and abroad.doc. Milan Kolena, ArtD. /Slovakia/

Milan Kolena is a conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, Associate Professor of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of the Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School, University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State University. He frequently



works as a member of the jury at various international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia. He was awarded the best conductor special prize of the "Singing World" choral competition in St. Petersburg, Russia in 2015. In the same year he held choral workshops in China and Hong Kong. He is a member of the International Council of the World Choir Games and Vice President World Youth and Children Choral Artists' Association. In 2018 he received the first place with his Apollo choir at "Moscow Sounds" Festival in Folk Music category and a Grand Prix for Sacred Music category.

Ceny

Každé teleso dostane diplom s označením pásma, v ktorom sa umiestnilo. Porota može udeliť aj mimoriadne ceny napr. za dramaturgiu programu, hlasovú kultúru, štýlovú intepretácii, dirigentský výkon a pod. Výsledky poroty sú konečné a nedá sa proti nim odvolať.

Competition repertoire

The time limit of each performance for choirs is 15 minutes (a piano will be available). The time limit for instrumental groups is 20 minutes.

The youth ensemble consists of 13 people. The composition may vary, depending on the employment of the musicians at the moment. Sometimes we invite a rock band to join together to make music together. The ensemble was created 3 years ago with the goal of uniting the talented young musicians of the city into one collective for creative projects. In the repertoire of the orchestra music of different genres, style and eras. Starting from classical music (Haydn, Mozart) and ending with popular pop music and rock music. Also in the repertoire of the orchestra there is music from movies and computer games.

Olesya Pistova entered a musical school in the city of Nikolaev (in the class of bayan). In June 1999 she graduated from the music school, and entered the music academy A.V. Nezhdanova in Odessa. In June 2004, she graduated from the music academy A.V. Nezhdanova, and she received a full degree in the specialty "Musical Art", got the qualification of the orchestra (ensemble), conductor of the folk instrument orchestra, and a teacher from the class of bayan. In July 2004, she again joined the Academy of Music at the Opera and Symphony Conducting Chair. In June 2008, she graduated from the Academy, and received the qualification of the conductor of the symphony orchestra. Since January 2016, she has been working as a head of the youth chamber orchestra at the municipal wind music theater. In her work she devotes a lot of time to the formation of phrases and the development of musical material in terms of dramatic works. She is tryimg to teach teenagers in different styles and genres of musical art using an interesting and modern repertoire. She pays a lot of attention to classical works, because I believe that all skills of orchestral mastery are based on them.

KLARINETOVÝ SOUBOR PRACHATICE / CZECH REPUBLIC/

The Clarinet Ensemble Prachatice was founded on October 6, 2006 in Prachatice, South Bohemia. It is a chamber, four-member music ensemble, which was soon incorporated into the cultural awareness of the city. The members of the ensemble are Jan Hovorka, Petr Chalupsky, Tomas Janoušek and Jiří Pecka. For his short existence he played two hundred performances in many places in the Czech Republic and abroad (Sweden, Belgium, France, Croatia, Hungary, Germany, Austria, Poland, Slovakia, Italy, San Marino). He holds 15 gold and 3 silver awards from European music festivals (2011-2018), Grand Prix from Poland, and Second Prize Winner of the FestArt Festival in Austria. He has also participated in the Wind of Music festival in Jönköping (2009 and 2010) and the Deutsches Musikfest 2013 International Festival. He regularly participates in the opening ceremony of fine arts artists, initiates major events and musically illustrates these events. The repertoire of the Clarinet ensemble of Prachatice is a versatile interpretation of the compositions of classicism, romanticism, 20th century music, swing, adaptation of film and musical music to jazz tunes. He works closely with music composer and pedagogue František Jančík. He has seven music CDs on his account.

In 1957 two enthusiastic teachers, Frans Sunaert and Robert Bollen, wished to pimp the annual end-of-schoolyear party with a few flagdance pieces. Not much later they found they were out of inspiration and they called in the help of dance-teacher Alicia Borghten from Antwerp. She managed to put the only-boys dance group on the tracks of time with choreographies inspired by classic and contemporary composers. In 1982 girls were admitted to dance with Imago Tijl, thus opening new perspectives but also doubling the numbers of members to an odd 200 dancers. In 1988 the younger ones spinned

off into Imago Junior with their very own dance show entitled Early Cadenzas. Meanwhile Birgit Hannes and Luc Morren had taken over from retiring Alicia. Together they created new and adventurous choreographies for Imago Tijl.

Luc Morren is already several decades a very active man in the art world of Belgium. He is connected as choreographer and/or dance teacher to Imago Tijl, Art school of Northern-Limburg, Pantarei, Musart and the choir Scala. He was also active as host choreographer to several dance ensembles abroad. He created dances for the Dance academy in Tilburg (The Netherlands), dance group Sidharte of Strombeek-Bever (Belgium), flags dance group Symbolica from Genk (Belgium), the ballet school Stowarzyszenie Przyjaciól Tanca of Lublin (Poland) and a masterclass contemporary dance in Guadalajara (Mexico). In the year 1995, Luc has won the prize for cultural achievement of the city of Lommel. For the city of Lommel he directed several projects as 'A Christmas carol', 'Sirk the Soeverein', 'Amoureus' (an art project of 10 days). And also for this art project he created the solo dance 'Amoureus' for Wim Vanlessen, principal dancer of the Royal Ballet of Flanders.

Primate's Palace

The monumental Renaissance palace rebuilt in Classicist style used to be the seat of Cardinal Jozef Batthyányi. The palace's function is symbolized by a black cardinal's hat that can be seen on the top of the roof. In the past, the palace witnessed many crucial moments in the country's history, e.g. signing of the "Peace of Bratislava" after Napoleon's victory at the Battle of Austerlitz. Today it houses a precious collection of paintings and tapestries with ancient Greek motives that were discovered by chance during the palace's reconstruction.



Main square

The history of the square dates back to the early Medieval period when there used to be a market and the place of citizens' meetings and trials. The Old Town Hall with Gothic interiors and baroque steeple today houses the city museum and often hosts concerts of classic, jazz of folk music in the courtyard. The square's main highlight is the fountain with the statue of the famous knight Roland who, as the legends say, used to dwell in Bratislava for a long time. Bratislava is a beautiful city full of culture that is gradually being discovered by visitors from all over the world. It also has the reputation of the city of music, offering its visitors and citizens rich and coulourful music events throughout the year. St. Martin's Cathedral

This Gothic cathedral constructed in the 14th century served as coronation place of Hungarian kings from 1563 to 1830 . The cathedral's important



Jesuit church

The church was built in 1638 in neo-renaissance style and is one of the biggest Bratislava churches. Its simple exterior decoration contrasts to the beautifully ornated interior. The two side naves are adorned with beutiful baroque altars from the 18th century. The main altar with monumental pillars comes from the 19th century. One of the church's highlights is a unique rococo pulpit from 1753 made of unusual combination of wood, lead and gold. The church has a very good accoustics and is often a venue of classic and sacred music concerts.
