J. Scott Ferguson is Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Illinois Wesleyan University, where he conducts the Collegiate Choir and University Choir and teaches studio voice, choral conducting, and choral literature. Dr. Ferguson received his undergraduate training at Oberlin Conservatory in organ performance, studying with Haskell Thomson. He completed graduate studies in choral conducting at the University of California, Irvine, earning the Master of Fine Arts, and the University of Wisconsin, Madison, where he earned the Doctor of Musical Arts. He has studied choral conducting with Robert Fountain, Joseph Huszti, Daniel Moe, and Howard Swan, orchestral conducting with David Becker and James Smith, and voice

with Robert Fountain, Joseph Huszti, and Beverly Rinaldi. Prior to his appointment at Illinois Wesleyan University in 1996, he served on the faculty at the State Conservatory of Music in Bratislava, Slovak Republic, Hope College, Plymouth State University, The College of Wooster, and the University of California, Irvine. His choirs have appeared on tour throughout the United States and Europe and have performed at state and regional ACDA and NAfME conferences. Dr. Ferguson is in demand as a choral clinician, festival conductor, and adjudicator, and has presented choral workshops and lectures in the U. S., Europe, and South America. Dr. Ferguson directs the Chapel Choir at Second Presbyterian Church in Bloomington and is organist and cantor at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Chenoa, IL.

Assoc. prof. Ondrej Šaraj, ArtD. / Slovakia/

Ondrej Šaray studied orchestral conducting with Zdeněk Bílek at the Conservatory in Bratislava. He also studied with Ladislav Slovák at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava. Since 1983 he has worked as the conductor of the Bratislava Children's Choir. In 1987 he estabilished the Youth Choir Echo and in 1992 the Amadeus Choir Bratislava. Ondrej Šaray has won many significant domestic and international awards with these choirs. As a conductor, he has performed throughout Europe, Canada, Africa, the USA and



he also cooperated with the noted orchestras of Slovakia (Philharmonic Orchestra, State Philharmonic Orchestra Košice, State Chamber Orchestra Žilina). He and his choirs appear regularly in vocal-instrumental compositions with the Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra, Slovak Chamber Orchestra of Bohdan Warchal, Capella Istropolitana and Musica Aeterna. Ondrej Šaray has also made recordings for Slovak Radio, Slovak Television and BBC London. Besides conducting, he teaches at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava.

INTERNATIONAL JURY

Prof. David Slater / Australia/

David Slater is an experienced conductor, having worked under the former Chief Conductor of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. He has conducted student, amateur and professional orchestras and choirs throughout the world, and many seasons of musical theatre. Mr Slater has founded and directed a number of awardwinning music organisations which include contemporary music ensembles, orchestras, choirs, youth orchestras and musical theatre



companies. He is a regular quest conductor of orchestras and choirs, workshop conductor for schools, music camps and festivals, and conducts masterclasses in many parts of the world, most recently in Austria, Latvia and Russia. He has worked with choirs and orchestras from the USA, Spain, France, Hungary, China, Singapore, Taiwan, Japan, UK, Ireland, Hong Kong and in Australia, Mr Slater is an Australian composer and a Represented Artist with the Australian Music Centre. He studied at the University of Sydney followed by post-graduate studies on scholarship in Germany. His work, twice short-listed for Australia's richest composition award, includes genres from the concert hall to TV, film and advertising. It encompasses solo, chamber, choral and orchestral music from professional to student levels. He receives regular commissions and his work is performed throughout Australia and the world. He has over 35 years' experience as a music educator at tertiary and secondary level, with 25 years as Director of Music. He has taught and lectured in 3 Australian states, at the School of Music at the Australian National University, on the sessional staff of the Queensland Conservatorium of music and in elite schools. He has been a consultant on music curriculum and given seminars in several countries. He is passionate about the place of music in society and in education, and has promoted the creation, study and performance of great music throughout his career. Mr Slater is sought after as a performance adjudicator, having worked with many organisations, festivals and eisteddfods. Positions have included final year examiner in three Australian states and jury member for festivals around the world. These include the World Choir Games in Sochi (Russia), the Summa Cum Laude International Youth Music Festival in Vienna (Austria) the Leonardo da Vinci and Lorenzo de'Medici International Choral Festivals in Florence (Italy), the European Choir Games and Choral Grand Prix of Nations in Riga (Latvia), the Queen of the Adriatic Sea International Choral Competition in Cattolica (Italy), the Rimini International Choral Festival (Italy) and the Bratislava International Youth Music Festivals (Slovakia). He has won many major awards for composition, conducting and services to music in the community, including the Symphony Australia Prize, the National Award of the Orchestras of Australia Network and Australia Day awards for services to music in the community. He has published articles on music and music education and is Australia's representative to the World Choir Council.

Milan Kolena is a conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, Associate Professor of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of the Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School, University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State

University. He frequently works as a member of the jury at various international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia. He was awarded the best conductor special prize of the "Singing World" choral competition in St. Petersburg, Russia in 2015. In the same year he held choral workshops in China and Hong Kong. He is a member of the International Council of the World Choir Games and Vice President World Youth and Children Choral Artists' Association. In 2018 he received the first place with his Apollo choir at "Moscow Sounds" Festival in Folk Music category and a Grand Prix for Sacred Music category.

The OIGA ORCHESTRA Città di Ortona (OST) had already performed for important institutions and regional music reviews: Theater "F. P. Tosti "- Ortona (Ch), Municipal Theater "A. Di Jorio "- Atessa (Ch), Mozart Week – Chieti, Frentana Musical Summer – Lanciano (Ch), Vasto Film Festival – Vasto (Ch), Marrucino Theater of Chieti. They were also invited to the prestigious GEZZIAMOCI Festival 2013, 2014 and 2015 in Matera and Melfi, appearing on the bill with internationally renowned artists, such



as Paolo Fresu, Rita Marcotulli, Triluk Gurtu, the Area, Danilo Rea. In July 2014 they were invited by the Italian Embassy in Brussels and by the A.N.E.A. to hold a series of concerts in Belgium on the occasion of the opening of the Italian Presidency of the European Union. In 2017 they participate in the YOUNG BOHEMIA FESTIVAL in Prague (Czech Rep.) Performing at the Church of St. Nicholas and at the Mayakovsky Hall of the National House Vinhorady, obtaining on that occasion the GOLD LEVEL (the only Italian orchestra).

Mr. Paulo Angelucci graduated in 2001, 2007 and 2011 he graduated cum laude in Musical Disciplines (Interpretative – Compositional in Violin and Chamber Music) at the Faculty of Teramo and in 2009 in Instrumental Didactics. SIAULIAI BOYS' AND YOUTH CHOIR DAGILELIS /LITHUANIA/

Conductor: Mr Remigijus Adomaitis

Siauliai Boys' Choir "DAGILELIS" is a significant cultural phenomenon in Lithuania, founded by Remigijus Adomaitis in 1990. By virtue of its energetic choir director, his pedagogical and organizational abilities, choir biography enhanced by important accomplishments and concert tours in numerous counties around the world. In 1999 opened singing



school "DAGILELIS" presented new perspectives for the art of singing. Remigijus Adomaitis with Siauliai Boys' Choir "DAGILELIS" received various international Choir Competition awards, had concerts in Germany, USA, China, Poland, France, Italy, Ireland, Spain, the Czech Republic, the United Kingdom, Latvia, Estonia, Slovenia, Russia, and Belarus. Remigijus Adomaitis conducted master classes in Lithuania, USA, Germany, China, the Czech Republic, Latvia, Switzerland, Poland, Russia, and Belarus. He is a Chief Conductor in a number of Lithuanian song celebrations, festivals, schoolchildren song festivals, worked as a member of Jury at International Choir Competitions, an expert and consultant of choirs, a member of Lithuanian Choir Union. Remigijus Adomaitis received various awards for his diverse educational and social activities, significant contributions and special merits to Lithuanian culture and art.

Each year "DAGILELIS" holds a number of concerts. The young singers rejoice the hearts of the audience by their perfect performance, emotionality and their vibrant sounding voices. The contribution of "DAGILELIS" to the cultural life of Siauliai and Lithuania, efforts of cherishing the choir singing traditions and the representation of the Lithuanian choral art in foreign countries have been

ETSU CHORALE /THE UNITED STATES/

Conductor: Dr. Matthew Potterton

The East Tennessee State University Chorale, under the direction of Dr. Matthew Potterton, has toured throughout the United States and Internationally. Most recently, the ETSU Chorale competed in the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod in Wales and placed first in two categories and second in another. Members of the Chorale are chosen through a selective audition process and must be dedicated to the highest level of artistry. The group performs in a variety of styles and genres, ranging from music of the Renaissance to newly composed works. The



choir also performed for the world famous men's ensemble, Chanticleer. In a master class, members of Chanticleer noted the ETSU Chorale was an elite University ensemble, "We hear choirs from around the world and few sound as good as this choir!" The Chorale was also a featured performing ensemble at the 2016 Tennessee Music Educator's Association's conference in Nashville.

Dr. Matthew Potterton is Department of Music Chair and Co-Director of Choral Activities at East Tennessee State University. He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Colorado University, Boulder, and a Master's Degree (MFA) in both Vocal Performance and Choral Conducting from the University of California, Irvine. Under the direction of Dr. Potterton, the ETSU Chorale has toured nationally and internationally. In 2019, the ETSU Chorale competed in the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod in Wales and placed first in two categories and second in another. The internationally renowned judges had positive comments including, "Beautiful tone, very expressive singing," and "Such an exciting, energized sound!" Dr. Potterton resides in

ETSU GREYSCALE /THE UNITED STATES/

Conductor: Dr. Alan Stevens

Greyscale, under the direction of Dr. Alan Stevens, is one of the premier vocal ensembles in the East Tennessee State University Department of Music. The ensemble was formed in 2013. The group performs a mix of contemporary choral works, pop arrangements, and vocal jazz. The select group of twelve singers who formed the group called themselves "Greyscale" to represent the non-specific type of music they perform – avoiding categorization in any clearly-defined, black-or-white genre. Greyscale released its first album in April of 2016, self-titled "Greyscale." Their second album, "Spectrum," was released in March of 2017, followed by their third album "Five



Alive," in 2018 to celebrate their fifth anniversary. This was followed up in December 2018 with a holiday album, "Christmastime in Tennessee." All albums are available on major streaming services, including Spotify, Apple Music, Amazon, and more. Greyscale has performed with New York Voices, The Swingles, and Voces8. The group tours frequently and has performed in New York City, Washington D.C., Nashville, and throughout the northeastern Tennessee region. The group annually hosts BucAppella, a non-competitive exhibition for high school and university contemporary ensembles. Guest artists for BucAppella have included Deke Sharon, Ben Bram, and Sara Brimer-Davey. Greyscale is inspired by ensembles such as The Swingles, Real Group, Manhattan Transfer, New York Voices, Voces 8, and Pentatonix. The singers in Greyscale are selected

through a rigorous audition process. Students must re-audition each year, and they must be able to perform as both an ensemble singer and a lead vocalist.

RYTMIKAPINA /FINLAND/

Conductor: Mrs. Pia Korteala

Rytmikapina comes from Töölö Music Institute in Helsinki, Finland. Its members include Jira Aarnio-Vuoti, Tuuli Rantapaju, Rhianna Fitzpatrick, Alex Home, Ossi Kettle and Enni Hämäläinen. The teacher and arranger of the group is Pia Korteala, a piano and rhythmics teacher, and the group has worked together for many years. Rytmikapina performs cover



versions of popular songs with unusual acoustic instruments. Jira is the lead singer of the group. She also, like Tuuli and Enni, plays boomwhackers, glockenspiel, strumstick, whatever is needed, along with Ossi, who also takes care of video and sound editing. Aside from odd instruments, Alex plays the trumpet and Rhianna sings backing vocals, whistles and is the live "drum machine" of the group. The members of Rytmikapina share a love of music and wish to continue making music and art together in one way or another.

Pia Korteala is a piano, theory and rhythmics teacher as well as the vice-principal in Töölö Music Institute in Helsinki, Finland, responsible for arranging concerts. In year 2017 Tikari Flutes has become Laureate of National radio competition for young musicians Concerto Bohemia 2017. In July 2018 Tikari Flutes has reached GOLD AWARD in the World orchestra festival in Vienna. In 2019 Tikari Flutes has become again Laureate of National radio competition for young musicians Concerto Bohemia in category bands and orchestras under 16 years. In May 2019 TIKARI Flutes won 1st prise Cum Laude at international competitive festival in Belgium Neerpelt. In July 2019 TIKARI Flutes has took part at China Tour in Harbin, Bailu and Beiing city.

Flauto Armonico is an orchestra at Žerotín Art School in Olomouc. It has about 30 members and took its present shape in 2014. Its art directors are Jana Kropáčková and Šárka Bilanová. Flauto Armonico presents its rich repertory at various events in our region, such as the Night of Churches, European Heritage Days etc. The orchestra has been successful at international festivals.



At Bydgoskielmfresje Muziczue in Poland we received a "Special Award of the Organizer". In 2017 Flauto Armonico was awarded the silver level at an international competition in Bratislava. In 2018 we represented our school at a successful tour to Šahy and the surroundings in Slovakia. In 2019, we won the 1st prize at an international competition in Neerpelt, Belgium.

Jana Kropáčková has attended flute classes of Professor František Malotín where Jana was trained by teachers from all over Europe. For many years I was a soloist of the Přerov Chamber Orchestra and a member of the Olomouc Brass Band. We played all around Europe. She started teaching at the Art School in Přerov and later at Žerotín Art School in Olomouc where she has been working until now. Along wih her students, Jana attended many international youth meetings in different countries, such as Germany, Serbia, Finland etc. Recently, with her colleague Šárka Bilanová, who is a harpist, and they have put together a student orchestra called "Flauto Armonico". KLARINETOVÝ SOUBOUR PRACHATICE

The Clarinet ensemble of Prachatice was founded on October 6, 2006 in Prachatice, South Bohemia. It is a chamber, four-member music ensemble, which was soon incorporated into the cultural awareness of the city. Members: Jan Hovorka, Petr Chalupsky, Tomáš Janoušek, Vít Neužil a Petra Sovová. During his short existence he performed two hundred performances in many places in the Czech Republic and abroad (Sweden, Belgium, France, Croatia, Hungary, Germany, Austria, Poland, Slovakia, Italy, San Marino.). He holds 23 gold and 3 silver awards from European music festivals (2011-2021), Grand Prix from Poland, and Second Prize Winner of the FestArt Festival in Austria. He also attended the Wind of Music festival in Jönköping (2009 and 2010) and the Deutsches Musikfest 2013 International Festival. In the Czech Republic, he has brought the Audience Award as the most successful ensemble of the 2009



Chamber Charts Show in Nové Hrady. He regularly attends vernissage of visual artists, initiates significant events and illustrates musically. The repertoire of the Clarinet ensemble of Prachatice is a versatile interpretation of the compositions of classicism, romanticism, 20th century music, swing, adaptation of film and musical music to jazz tunes. He works closely with music composer and pedagogue František Jančík. He has seven music CDs on his account.

In 1957 two enthusiastic teachers, Frans Sunaert and Robert Bollen, wished to pimp the annual end-of-schoolyear party with a few flag-dance pieces. Not much later they found they were out of inspiration and they called in the help of dance-teacher Alicia Borghten from Antwerp. She managed to put the only-boys dance group on the tracks of time with choreographies inspired by classic and contemporary compo-



sers. In 1982 girls were admitted to dance with Imago Tijl, thus opening new perspectives but also doubling the numbers of members to an odd 200 dancers. In 1988 the younger ones spinned off into Imago Junior with their very own dance show entitled Early Cadenzas. Meanwhile Birgit Hannes and Luc Morren had taken over from retiring Alicia. Together they created new and adventurous choreographies for Imago Tijl, performing in Belgium and all over the world.

Luc Morren is already several decades a very active man in the art world of Belgium. He is connected as choreographer and/or dance teacher to Imago Tijl, Art school of Northern-Limburg, Pantarei, Musart and the choir Scala. He was also active as host choreographer to several dance ensembles abroad. He created dances for the Dance academy in Tilburg (The Netherlands), dance group Sidharte of Strombeek-Bever (Belgium), flags dance group Symbolica from Genk (Belgium), the ballet school Stowarzys-



zenie Przyjaciól Tanca of Lublin (Poland) and a masterclass contemporary dance in Guadalajara (Mexico). In the year 1995, Luc has won the prize for cultural achievement of the city of Lommel. For the city of Lommel he directed several projects as 'A Christmas carol', 'Sirk the Soeverein', 'Amoureus' (an art project of 10 days). And also for this art project he created the solo dance 'Amoureus' for Wim Vanlessen, principal dancer of the Royal Ballet of Flanders.

SCHOLA GREGORIANA BRATISLAVENSIS (SLOVAKIA)

Conductor: Milan Kolena Non-competing choir

Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis was founded in 2002. Its activities and goals focus on semiologic interpretation of Gregorian chant according to the oldest semiologic sources from 9.-11. cent. and on presenting Gregorian chants originated in Slovak 13.-15. cent. liturgic tradition.

Among schola's important activities has been CD recording of three Bratislava antiphonaries from the end of 15. century, which was a part



of UNESCO project World's memory in Slovak Republic. The Medieval Slovak manuscripts were thus for the first time presented to the cultural and professional audiences both home and abroad. One of the schola's concert highlights has been the participation in Gregorian chant festival in Florence (2008) where the schola presented with success also chants from the Bratislava antiphonary. The art director and founder of the schola is Dr. Milan Kolena.

Milan Kolena is conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, teacher of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions all over the Europe. During 2004-2006 together with Schola Gregoriana Bratisalvensis recorded 3 CDs of Bratislava antiphons for Slovak National Library. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School, University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State University, topic: The Question of the Interpretation of Latin texts in Sacred Choral Music. He frequently works as a member of the jury at many international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia.



Conductor: Milan Kolena Non-competing choir

Choir Apollo was established in 1995 and in a short time the choir made considerable strides, achieving notoriety in Slovakia and receiving many awards at festivals and international competitions e.g. in Prague (1998), Český Krumlov (2002), Olomouc (2005).The choir often gives performances at prestigious local and international events. Apollo has toured Italy and other countries performing concerts at festivals in Citta´ di Nuoro, Rome, Fano,



Loreto, Olbia; Poznan, Poland; Banja Luka, Bosna Hercegovina; Szeged, Miskolc, Hungary; Munich, Germany; Prague, Olomouc, Brno and Pardubice, Czech Republic; Vienna, Austria as well as in many Slovak towns. The choir's repertoire focuses on current sacred Slovak works; the choir interprets extensive pieces by outstanding Slovak composer Pavol Krška, including Stabat Mater; Rekviem; Te Deum for solo, choir and organ; Missa Solemnis for organ, sola and mixed choir. The Apollo repertoire also includes sacred choruses from the Gregorian Chant period, as well as Renaissance and Romantic period selections; spirituals, folksongs and carols in choir arrangements. Choir Apollo has recorded a CD of Anton Bruckner works – Moteta in 2003 and made a recording of Pavol Krška's Rekviem for two choirs, sola and organ in 2012. The choir regularly sings at Holy Masses in Jesuit and other churches in Bratislava and gives charity concerts for children oncology hospital in Bratislava. It performs concerts also with University of Performing Arts soloists or in cooperation with other Slovak or foreign choirs.



Milan Kolena is conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, teacher of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions all over the Europe. During 2004-2006 together with Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis recorded 3 CDs of Bratislava antiphons for Slovak National Library. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School,

University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State University, topic: The Question of the Interpretation of Latin texts in Sacred Choral Music. He frequently works as a member of the jury at many international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia.
